Principal's Message



Dear Parents/Carers,

Out of School Hours Supervision

A reminder to parents that supervision by staff begins at 8:30am each morning. If you need to drop off your child before this time, they need to be enrolled in St Nicholas OOSH. Over the past few weeks, we have noticed an increase in the number of children arriving at school, as early as 8am!

This is very dangerous as staff are not on duty, so if a child was to injure themselves no one would be on duty to assist. In the afternoon, the pick-up is supervised until 3:30pm. I know it can be very busy in the afternoon and sometimes parents/carers run late, so please contact the school office on 49381541 to let us know that you will be late. After 3:30pm, children waiting to be collected will be brought to the school office to wait for their parents/carers.

Office of Safeguarding

Keeping parents and carers informed about the legislation and procedures around reporting a child protection concern is important. Please read the articles below for your information.

The Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012

Under this legislation people who undertake a role in child-related work in a paid or volunteer capacity in the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle are required by law to have a Working with Children Check Clearance. This 'Clearance' can be obtained from applying online at check@kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au. As a parent, if we learn about a staff member or a volunteer working in the school without a Clearance, we should talk with the Principal or Assistant Principal as soon as possible. If we believe that nothing is being done about our concerns, we can contact the Office of Safeguarding directly (Ph. 4979 1390 Mon-Fri).

Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle Reporting Policy

As a parent we can report any concerns we have for a student, or group of students, to our principal, assistant principal or directly to the Office of Safeguarding (Ph. 4979 1390 Mon-Fri). Information about reporting concerns for a child can be found on the Office of Safeguarding website: https://officeofsafeguarding.org.au/reporting-abuse/. As parents we are entitled to contact the Office of Safeguarding directly about any concerns we have about the safety, welfare or wellbeing of a child or if we are concerned that the school isn't addressing allegations of reportable conduct or abuse.

Tell Them from Me Survey

All parents/carers at Rosary Park Branxton are invited to contribute to a community consultation survey. The survey is now open (closing on 22 October 2020). The survey is anonymous, voluntary and easy to use. It takes about 20 minutes to complete and covers parents' perceptions of the school's support for learning, positive behaviours, and the promotion of safety and inclusion. Students in Years 4–6 will also participate in the survey during class time this week. Parents/carers have already received a non-consent note which was to be returned by last week if you did NOT want your child participating in the survey. The insights we gain into parent and staff communication, activities and practices at home, and parent voice on the school's support of learning, faith formation and behaviour will build an accurate and timely picture that schools can use for practical improvements. This is your chance to provide valuable feedback about your school and support school planning and future direction and we welcome your participation, suggestions and comments. The school community will receive findings and proposed actions for improvement following completion of the survey process.



Imaginaturalists Drawing Nature Workshop - Tuesday September 29th, ages 8+, Cost \$5.00


Drawing Nature - explore our natural world through creativity in this beautiful workshop run by local artist Gillian Hewitt, founder of Imaginaturalists.

DANCE AUDITION: MONDAY 26 OCTOBER 2020

The dance audition is entirely workshop-based. You will be taken through some skills-based exercises before learning some new choreography. You may have an opportunity to add your own choreography so it's a good idea to have some ideas in your head about what you might do.

DRAMA AUDITION: TUESDAY 27 OCTOBER 2020 AND WEDNESDAY 28 OCTOBER 2020

The drama auditions are comprised of a half hour workshop comprising of a series of drama exercises in movement, voice, character work and devising (creating short scenes). Auditionees will also be required to prepare a short one minute monologue. A list of topics for Junior applicants will be on the website from Week 7 of Term 3 whilst Senior applicants will be required to source a monologue of their choice.

INSTRUMENTAL AUDITION: MONDAY 26 OCTOBER 2020

All instrumental auditions are 10 minutes. You are required to prepare a short piece that you feel shows off your ability. After performing your piece for the panel, you will either be given some sight reading, asked to perform some scales or asked to improvise around some chords or with another instrument.

VOCAL AUDITION: THURSDAY 29 OCTOBER 2020

For your vocal audition you will be placed in a group of up to 20 students of similar age. The first part of the audition will comprise learning a new song as a group and some simple movement to go with it. This allows us to see how well you pick up new music, lyrics and movement and place them together, but it should also be fun! In the second half of the audition everyone will be required to sing the first verse and chorus of one of the ten selected songs. The list of songs will be live at the end of Term 3 2020. You will be required to sing with the backing track, and a link will be provided for each song so you can practice.
