Principal's Message

National Child Protection Week (3-9 September) is an annual event starting on the first Sunday of September. The theme 'Every child, in every community, needs a fair go' aims to spread the message that to treat all of Australia's children fairly, we need to make sure every family and community has what kids need to grow up safe and supported.

Throughout Child Protection Week, and at various times through the school year, we encourage students to learn about behaviours that will help to keep them safe. One important action that children can take is to speak to a trusted adult if they have any concerns. During child protection week, our Personal Development, Health & Physical Education (PDPHPE) will focus on protective behaviours to empower and educate our children on this very important topic.

It is important that we listen to, and value, what children have to say. Where possible, include their voices in decision making and be advocates for their best interest.

The Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle has an abiding commitment to promote the safety, welfare, and wellbeing of children. The Office of Safeguarding (OoSG) is the structural expression of the Diocese's commitment to demonstrate the highest standards of recognising and upholding the dignity and rights of all children.

School Attendance

Supporting positive school attendance is a shared responsibility - everyone has a role to play in promoting the regular attendance of students. All children should be at school on time each day and remain until the conclusion of lessons in the afternoon. This ensures a consistent routine for students which helps children feel secure, as well as allowing children to learn and grow. Days off school not only contribute to significant gaps and lost opportunities in learning, it is also hard for children to establish, develop and maintain social connections.

We ask that you try to limit appointments through the school day where possible. These appointments are important for your child to attend.

Frequent lateness should also be avoided, as children need to get into a good routine each morning. If you are having difficulty getting your child to school on time, please talk to their class teacher.

<u>Uniform</u>

We will move to full summer uniform <u>from Monday 11 September</u>. If the weather is warmer in the <u>week before</u> this, children can wear FULL summer uniform.

Our students adhere to our school's Uniform Policy with a high degree of consistency, and we greatly appreciate parental support shown in this aspect of school. Adherence to our policy strengthens pride in our School and promotes a positive image.

Just a few reminders regarding jewellery and nail polish

Students may wear one small stud or one sleeper in each ear lobe (silver or gold)

- One necklace of a religious significance (e.g. cross)
- One single signet ring
- One plain gold or silver golf bangle
- No nail polish to be worn at school

Hair must be neat and tidy. Collar length hair must be worn in a ponytail or plait. Scrunchies, hair clips, rubber bands, ponytail holders, etc must be blue/white in colour and is to be worn in the hair and not worn on the wrist.

Tracks, rats tails and patterns cut into the hair are <u>NOT</u> permitted. Thank you for your cooperation in this regard. If children have a mullet it must be blended at the sides and CANNOT touch the collar (or it must be tied back).

New 3-6 Syllabus for Mathematics and English - Online Training for staff

This term, we as a school have given our Year 3 to 6 teachers time to complete online training modules on the new syllabus documents. The new Mathematics and English Syllabus' will fall into line with the changes that have already been made to the K-2 documents. There have been some changes to the language used and the terminology in the documents, as well as changes to when and how content is taught. It is important that teachers are given time to access these documents and become familiar with the new structures during the trial period.


Wellbeing week:

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education

As part of their English and Science programs, Year 1 have been comparing the 4 main seasonal calendars to the seasonal calendar of the Larrakia people of Darwin who follow 7 seasons. The students loved learning about the ways that the weather patterns guide them to understand and apply sustainable living practices.

Some examples of this were:

- when turkey bush and wattles are blooming it is the best time to collect cockles.
- collecting only a few turtle eggs from each nest, so that there would be enough turtles hatching for the following season.
- understanding that they change their diet to suit the best foods for harvesting, for example native cherries and berries.
- collecting shellfish and mangrove worms on the mudflats as they become exposed by rain during the rainy season.

Students were encouraged to use symbols, pictures, and words to document their learning.

Wearing helmets and riding safely

Wearing helmets

Your child must wear a helmet when riding a bike in any public place — it's the law. The helmet must comply with the Australian and New Zealand standards and needs to be securely fitted and fastened on your child's head. It should be buckled firmly so it fits without wobbling or slipping to the sides.

Always remember to check that your child is wearing a helmet whenever they're playing or riding on wheels —

- · Bikes
- Foot scooters
- · Rollerskates
- Skateboards
- · Rollerblades.

Riding safely

Although children quickly learn to pedal, steer and brake, they aren't ready to cycle near traffic or on the road. Until they are at least 10 years old, your child should ride off-road away from vehicles and driveways.

The safest places to ride bikes, scooters and skateboards are within fenced areas. This helps your child from riding or falling onto the footpath or the road. Children under 16 and their accompanying supervising adult riders may ride on the footpath, unless there are signs specifically prohibiting cycling. Riders need to take special care at driveways where vehicles may be driving in or out.

At intersections, riders must dismount and wheel the bicycle across the road as a pedestrian, following the STOP! LOOK! LISTEN! THINK! procedure.

After performing your piece for the panel, you will either be given some sight reading, then asked to perform some scales or asked to improvise around some chords accompanied by another instrument.

DRAMA AUDITION

Tuesday 24 October and Wednesday 25 October 2023

The drama auditions are comprised of a half hour workshop comprising of a series of drama exercises in movement, voice, character work and devising (creating short scenes). Students will also be required to prepare a short one-minute monologue. A list of topics for Junior applicants will be on the ASPIRE website from Week 7 of Term 3, whilst Senior applicants will be required to source a monologue of their choice.

VOCAL AUDITION

Thursday 26 October 2023

For the one-hour vocal audition, you will be placed in a group of up to 20 students of similar age. The first part of the audition will comprise learning a new song as a group and some simple movement to go with it. This allows us to see how well you pick up new music, lyrics and movement. and place them together, but it will also be fun! In the second half of the audition everyone will be required to sing the first verse and chorus of one of the ten selected songs. The list of songs will be available on the ASPIRE website at the end of term 3 2022. You will be required to sing with the backing track (we provide).
