Child Safety

As we begin our school holidays, please remain vigilant as to the whereabouts of your child/ren. Whilst we may live in a small town, we can nevertheless drop our guard where the safety of our children is concerned. Please remind your child of the dangers of engaging in conversation with strangers regardless of what they may say or offer your child. Do they know what to do in instances such as these? Please talk with your child about this.

The Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012

Under this legislation people who undertake a role in child-related work in a paid or volunteer capacity in the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle are required by law to have a Working with Children Check Clearance. This 'Clearance' can be obtained from applying online at check@kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au. As a parent, if we learn about a staff member or a volunteer

working in the school without a Clearance, we should talk with the Principal or Assistant Principal as soon as possible. If we believe that nothing is being done about our concerns, we can contact the Office of Safeguarding directly (Ph. 4979 1390 Mon-Fri).

Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle Reporting Policy

As a parent we can report any concerns we have for a student, or group of students, to our principal, assistant principal or directly to the Office of Safeguarding (Ph. 4979 1390 Mon-Fri). Information about reporting concerns for a child can be found on the Office of Safeguarding website: https://officeofsafeguarding.org.au/reporting-abuse/. As parents we are entitled to contact the Office of Safeguarding directly about any concerns we have about the safety, welfare or wellbeing of a child or if we are concerned that the school isn't addressing allegations of reportable conduct or abuse.

This is a group of parents who may be called upon to give assistance or support to families in times of need. This may be meals, transport, or assistance with pick up/drop off of children. As we come to the end of term 3, teachers are busy planning engaging classroom programs across the curriculum to help children achieve their identified goals.



Does your child ride a bike or walk to and from school?

The Catholic Schools Office and Transport for NSW (TfNSW) Government guidelines states that parents must give written permission each year, for their child/ren to ride their bike or walk to and from school, with parents aware that children are under parent's duty of care once they leave school grounds. The School and TfNSW recommends that children under 10yrs DO NOT ride bicycles to or from school unless accompanied by an adult. Children under 12yrs should ride away from busy roads. They may ride bikes on the footpath unless there are signs that specifically prohibit cycling.

These permission notes need to be completed once each year per child. If your child/ren is likely to walk or ride to or from school, and you have not already done so, please complete the permission note available with this newsletter or contact the office to arrange for a note to be sent home with your child.





CANCELLATIONS AND ABSENCE

To change your booking, simply submit a new online booking form with your updated preferred days.

Please note, our cancellation policy requires notice of five (5) business days for cancellation of Vacation Care bookings. If you cancel within 5 business days of your booking, you will be charged the full rate.
