National Child Protection Week: 'Every conversation matters'.

National Child Protection Week invites all Australians to play their part to promote the safety and wellbeing of children and young people.

National Child Protection Week, taking place this year, aims to engage, educate, and empower Australians to understand the complexity of child abuse and neglect and work together to prevent it. This year, the theme of National Child Protection Week is 'Every conversation matters'.

Throughout Child Protection Week, and at various times through the school year, we encourage students to learn about behaviours that will help to keep them safe. One important action that children can take is to speak to a trusted adult if they have any concerns. During child protection week, our Personal Development, Health & Physical Education (PDPHPE) will focus on protective behaviours to empower and educate our children on this very important topic.

It is important that we listen to, and value, what children have to say. Where possible, include their voices in decision making and be advocates for their best interest.

The Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle has an abiding commitment to promote the safety, welfare, and wellbeing of children. The Office of Safeguarding (OoSG) is the structural expression of the Diocese's commitment to demonstrate the highest standards of recognising and upholding the dignity and rights of all children.

#### **Annual School Visit**

Yesterday we hosted the Heads of Service from the diocese of Maitland Newcastle to Rosary Park for their annual school visit.

Some of our Year 6 children warmly and responsibly welcomed the visitors to our school and gave them a firsthand experience of our school and all that makes it a welcoming and positive learning environment.

Mr Steve Lemos the Head of Schools and other members of the diocesan leadership team visited classrooms to see our third teacher and learning in action with some of our children having the opportunity to share their learning with the visitors in our classrooms.

The visitors were very affirming of the work we are doing at Rosary Park and as I said to the leaders yesterday, I am blessed to lead a school of innovative, caring and hard-working staff and to have children who want to learn and take pride in our Rosary Park community.



#### Learning Fair: An invitation to families

Learning and Teaching in Mathematics in schools today is very different to how we learnt at school.

In NSW in 2023 all Kindergarten, year 1 and year 2 children started a new Mathematics Syllabus as directed the National Education Standards Authority (NESA).

In 2024 Years 3-6 have done likewise. This has meant that as a school we have made Mathematics teaching and learning a major focus for our school improvement.

On **Wednesday 4 September** we will not have an awards assembly. Instead, Rosary Park invites you to our learning fair, an opportunity to spend time observing and discussing the Maths learning in your child/ren's classrooms. This will be an opportunity for you to talk with your child during their Maths activities about what they are learning and how.

The 40 minutes allocated is an opportunity for you to visit all your children's rooms and see first-hand your child working in Mathematics. As we give voice to our children as learners, they should be able to show you and explain some of their learning, both in the tasks they are working on and in the displays of learning around their classroom.

We will sound a bell halfway through this time so that you can move to your other child's classroom if required.

Teachers during this time will be busy with their class so this is not an opportunity to talk with the teacher. However, after 9:45 when the classroom visits conclude, you are invited to our staffroom to speak with our Pedagogical Mentors (PMs) Amber Van Duuren and Janelle Dixon if you have any questions about how we teach Mathematics. Perhaps there is a concept that your child has had in their homework, and you are not sure of how we now teach this. This a chance for you to understand more clearly how we now teach and learn in this area in the new syllabus.

We look forward to seeing you on 4<sup>th</sup> September.

#### **Sports Aerobics - National Titles**

Good luck to our three teams competing in the FISAF Sports Aerobics National Titles this Saturday 31 August. Thank you to the parents for showing such commitment in taking them to the Gold Cost for this event and to Kimberley Gargan who has worked so hard in training these teams over many months. Regardless of the outcome, I am immensely proud of you all and know you will represent our school with persistence and fairness.

#### **School Attendance**

Supporting positive school attendance is a shared responsibility - everyone has a role to play in promoting the regular attendance of students. All children should be at school on time each day and remain until the conclusion of lessons in the afternoon. This ensures a consistent routine for students which helps children feel secure, as well as allowing children to learn and grow. Days off school not only contribute to significant gaps and lost opportunities in learning, it is also hard for children to establish, develop and maintain social connections.

We ask that you try to limit appointments through the school day where possible. These appointments are important for your child to attend.

Frequent lateness should also be avoided, as children need to get into a good routine each morning. If you are having difficulty getting your child to school on time, please talk to their class teacher.

Parents need to be <u>VIGILANT</u> when dropping children near St Nick's. <u>PLEASE</u> watch them cross the driveway.

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#### Uniform

We begin the transition to summer uniform from 2 September FULL Summer uniform to be worn from Monday 9 September.

Our students adhere to our school's Uniform Policy with a high degree of consistency, and we greatly appreciate parental support shown in this aspect of school. Adherence to our policy strengthens pride in our School and promotes a positive image.

#### Just a few reminders regarding jewellery and nail polish

- Students may wear one small stud or one sleeper in each ear lobe (silver or gold)
- One necklace of a religious significance (e.g. cross)
- One single signet ring
- One plain gold or silver golf bangle
- No nail polish to be worn at school

Hair must be neat and tidy. Collar length hair must be worn in a ponytail or plait. Scrunchies, hair clips, rubber bands, ponytail holders, etc must be blue/white in colour and is to be worn in the hair and not worn on the wrist.

Tracks, rats tails and patterns cut into the hair are <u>NOT</u> permitted. Thank you for your cooperation in this regard. If children have a mullet it must be blended at the sides and CANNOT touch the collar (or it must be tied back).

# **Assistant Principal Message**

#### **National Child Protection Week**

The theme for this year's Child Protection Week is "Every Conversation Matters." At Rosary Park we have regular conversations around child safety, identifying safe and trusted adults and engage in lessons to support positive mental health and wellbeing. From September 2-8 across the diocese our schools have a particular focus on child safety and wellbeing. During this time, we educate our community about agencies that are available to support us in recognising and upholding the dignity and rights of all children and vulnerable adults.

At Rosary Park we are working on "decorate a space," a follow-on initiative from the "decorate your gate" promotion for Child Protection Week in the past. We will work on our decorated space on the grass at the front of the hall next Tuesday. Please feel free to check this out on Tuesday afternoon at pick up, or Wednesday morning at drop off. Keep an eye out for pictures to see how creative we can be in designing a focal point for a week that has such an important message around child safety and wellbeing.

#### Learning Fair – Wednesday 4 September

Do you have questions about how we teach Mathematics in the classroom today? Come and see our Pedagogical Mentors (PM's) Amber Van Duuren and myself in the staff room at around 9:45am on Wednesday 4 September after our Learning Fair open classrooms. Amber and I will have example anchor charts and bump it up walls used in the classrooms to help your child develop skills in mathematical thinking and reasoning. We hope to be able to answer any questions you may have on the way children are taught mathematics with a deeper focus on explaining the thinking than on the answer that has been given.

#### **PB4L focus**

For the past 2 weeks we have had a focus on the rule – I am an Active Learner, with the behaviour focus, I show courage when I persevere with a challenging task. In classrooms we have unpacked what this rule means and what it looks like in the classroom. The focus has been on the fact that there is nothing wrong with finding a task difficult. We have reasoned that any task is about showing effort, not about showing perfection. Please ask your child/children about their interpretation of our current PB4L behaviour focus.

# **Year 3 Taronga Zoo Excursion**



My Dear People,

In 2020 my predecessor Bishop Bill Wright decreed that the Sunday on or immediately prior to 15 September each year would be inscribed in the liturgical calendar of the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle as the 'Perpetual Day of Remembrance'. Those familiar with the Church's liturgical calendar would recognise that 15 September is also the day for "Our Lady of Sorrows". How could any of us fail to see and understand that the abuse of children by those placed in positions of leadership and trust in the Church is one of, if not the greatest, cause of sorrow in our Church's long history.

Even the mere recognition that such abominations have occurred in our Church causes us great pain and sorrow. How much greater is the pain of those who have been abused and still suffer because of that abuse, and how much greater than our own sorrow must be the sorrow of Our Lord Jesus and his mother Mary.

"To remember" can be a deeply spiritual and religious action. In the Old Testament, God's chosen people were often exhorted to remember the many good things that God had done for them as well as remembering their own sins and transgressions. Remembering God's goodness, both to ourselves as individuals and collectively as his people, produces gratitude and hope. Remembering our transgressions, both our own personal transgressions and the transgressions of the collective Church, produces redemptive sorrow and genuine conversion.

To assist us as the Church of Maitland-Newcastle to pray in this space the Perpetual Day of Remembrance Standing Committee of the Diocesan Liturgy Council once again offers a range of resources for use in our parishes, schools, agencies, groups, and homes. It has been determined that the resources this year include only minor changes from last year since later this year my office will undertake a review into the best way for us as a community to observe the Perpetual Day of Remembrance.

The resources for 2024 are available on the diocesan website for parishes and schools who wish to begin their preparation. There is something there for everyone including Diocesan agencies, individuals, households and community groups. Resources - Perpetual Day of Remembrance

I commend these resources to you and your local community for our remembering and praying.



#### **ENSEMBLES**

#### DRAMA AUDITION

#### Monday 28 October and Tuesday 29 October 2024

The drama auditions are comprised of a half hour workshop comprising of a series of drama exercises in movement, voice, character work and devising (creating short scenes). Students will also be required to prepare a short one-minute monologue. A list of topics for Junior applicants will be on the ASPIRE website from Week 7 of Term 3, whilst Senior applicants will be required to source a monologue of their choice.

#### DANCE AUDITION

#### Wednesday 30 October 2024

The audition is entirely workshop based. You will be taken through some skills-based exercises before learning some new choreography. You may have an opportunity to add your own choreography so it's a good idea to have some ideas ready about what you might like to do.

# INSTRUMENTAL AUDITION

All instrumental auditions are 10 minutes. You are required to prepare a short piece that you feel shows your ability. After performing your piece for the panel, you will either be given some music to sight read then asked to perform scales on your instrument or asked to improvise a melody whilst accompanied by another instrument.

#### **VOCAL AUDITION**


#### Thursday 31 October 2024

For the one-hour vocal audition, you will be placed in a group of up to 20 students of similar age. The first part of the audition will comprise of learning a new song as a group and some simple movement to go with it. This allows us to see how well you pick up new music, lyrics and movement and place them together. In the second half of the audition. everyone will be required to sing the first verse and chorus of one of the ten selected songs. The list of songs will be available on the ASPIRE website at the end of term 3. You will be required to sing with the backing track (we provide). A link will be provided to each applicant so they can practice.

Screens have increasingly become part of children's lives and can often be helpful and enjoyable for families. They can offer children opportunities to connect with friends and extended family, express creativity and learn.


Children and young people aged 5-17 years should limit sedentary recreational screentime to no more than 2 hours per day (excluding schoolwork).
