## Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you all have a happy and holy Easter time, our most important event as a Christian community.

We reflect on the Easter triduum from the chant of 'Hosanna!' on Palm Sunday to Good Friday when those chants change to 'Crucify Him, Crucify Him!' It is a reflection on our humanness of being both saint and sinner. Held in tension as we look to do better and be more the saint but

noting that sometimes we get some things wrong. Jesus dies to help us tip our balance for goodness. Our prayer from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday should always be one of gratitude, for strength, for grace, for forgiveness and for the transformation only Jesus can bring.

I hope that this Easter season is able to bring you this over the break.

### **Student Led Conferences**

Open and regular communication between school and home is so important to best optimise our children's learning outcomes. To this end we have now opened Compass for parents who wish to book a phone interview (10 mins' duration) with their child's teacher in week 1-2 of term 2. The bookings will close on Tuesday of the first week of the holidays (15 APRIL)

Please ensure that you answer the call from a private number. Attached to this newsletter you will find instructions on how to book a time for this phone interview.

Semester one reports will be available to parents in the week of Wednesday 25 June. Then on Monday 30 June we will hold Student led conferences for *ALL children and their parents to attend on this allocated day which is a PUPIL FREE DAY.*

Through the outstanding work of all staff and students, through the Leading Learning Collaborative (LLC), wonderfully led by the Executive Team here at RPB, children use Learning Intentions and Success Criteria to achieve success in a learning task and during this term they have started the setting of goals in aspects of their numeracy and literacy learning which will be shared and discussed with you at their conference on 30 June. At this conference the child is not only present but is encouraged to explain their progress and reflect on their accomplishments and set goals.

### **MAT life skills program**

In Term 2 our year 5 6 children will participate in this weekly program. This is a therapeutic martial arts program that combines the principles of physical and mental wellbeing with those of therapeutic martial art training techniques. Its format engages and empowers young people to learn life skills and to better manage the challenges in their lives. The program uses drills, games, metaphors, and stories to deliver the physical, and mental wellbeing objectives. It does NOT involve sparring of any form.

Trained life skill instructors Darius and Lisa Wingate-Pearse (with the assistance of class teachers) will lead the children every week, commencing in the second week of Term 2, on a Tuesday. Please refer to your note, which was given out by teachers / place on Compass.

The philosophy of the program is BE STRONG - BE CALM - BE KIND - TRY HARD

The school is providing the funding for this initiative.

Grades 3 and 4 will participate in the program in term 3.

### **Complaints and Concerns - A Positive Approach**

Concerns arise at schools for a variety of reasons, sometimes due to the very busy nature of the school environment.

In addition to solid teaching & learning, there are many extra curricula activities to enhance school life, and a great deal of coordination is required. Accordingly, many considered decisions are made every day by our professional team to ensure the safety and wellbeing of students, staff and the wider community, and promote learning for all. At the same time, the school community

is quite diverse, with many individuals or groups having vastly different opinions on how things should be done.

It is inevitable therefore, that times will arise when some parents agree with the school's actions while others disagree and wish to discuss the matter and seek clarification with the school. We welcome such discussions and encourage parents to raise issues so that they can be dealt with speedily and resolved to the satisfaction of all concerned.

Raising concerns or seeking clarification is not a negative experience if everyone focuses on it being a solution-focused experience by valuing everyone's opinions. The following process for presenting and managing parental concerns works well and is the way we manage all concerns at our school.

The diocese now has a new complaints and feedback process. Brochures are available in our school foyer should you wish to access these.

In the two weeks prior to this, parents are welcome to use their discretion and if there is a cold snap children can wear their Winter uniform. ### **Staffing**

Mrs Janelle Dixon, our Assistant Principal, has been seconded by the Catholic Schools Maitland-Newcastle to serve as Acting Assistant Principal at St Patrick's Lochinvar, during the First six weeks of Term Two. This change has been facilitated by Mr Dennis Nolan at St Patrick's Lochinvar, being seconded to St Peter's Stockton in the absence of their Principal, Mr Michael Punch, who will be going on Long Service Leave.

During this time the following changes will occur at Rosary Park:

- Miss Mackenzie Gageler will undertake the role of Assistant Principal during this time. Her Executive Release teacher will remain as Mrs Deb Parkes. The class function will remain exactly as normal.
- Miss Grace Dever will undertake the role of Religious Education Coordinator. Her Executive Release teacher will be Miss Maddy Percival. Miss Percival will work on Year 4 Blue on Thursdays and Fridays.
- Ms Amber van Duuren will undertake the roles of Primary Coordinator and Pedagogical Mentor (0.4) for the 6 week period. Her Executive Release teacher will be Mrs Paige Pringle, who will work in Year 6 Blue on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursdays for the six week block. We welcome Mrs Pringle back to the staff.
- Miss Nikola Groves will continue in her role of Gifted Education Mentor and Miss Maddy Percival will continue to release her on Tuesdays.
- Due to Mrs Dixon's secondment, an opportunity has come up for an English As a Language or Dialect (EAL/D) teacher. Mrs Kate Burgess will be undertaking this role 2 days per week.

- We also welcome back Mrs Nichola Ellis, as Learning Support Teacher. She will be joining Mrs Kathryn Piggott from April 28.
- Sadly we will see the departure of Mrs Melita Robertson, from Rosary Park as Learning Support Assistant - Admin, Ms Linda Museth, Learning Support Assistant and Mr Jeremy Brown, Learning Support Assistant, whose contracts expire at the conclusion of Term One. I wish to publicly thank Melita, Linda and Jeremy for their contributions to our school and wish them all the very best for their futures.

# Guide to Holy Week

**Palm Sunday**  
Sunday before Easter. Celebration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Observed with palm branches, parades, and celebration.

**Maundy Thursday**  
Thursday before Easter. Commemorates the Last Supper. Often observed with foot washing, stripping of the altar, and overnight prayer vigil to keep watch with Jesus in the garden.

**Good Friday**  
Friday before Easter. Most solemn day of the church year. Observes the day Jesus was crucified. Observed by praying the Stations of the Cross and three hours of silent prayer while Jesus was on the cross.

**Holy Saturday**  
Saturday before Easter. Observes the day Jesus was in the tomb. This is a day of somber reflection, reflecting on what we'd miss in a world without Jesus.

**Easter Sunday**  
Hallelujah! Christ has risen! This day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Sing hallelujahs and celebrate with great joy.

## **Pope Francis:**

Francis' Focus – Who better to help guide us in the true depth and meaning of our Catholic faith than the charismatic and authentic leader of our Church, Pope Francis. Below he encourages us to go out and live joyfully the Easter message that Christ is alive: Reflecting on Easter, Pope Francis highlights the importance of 'walking away from the tomb.' Once found, faith must be lived. As Saint Peter said, 'we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people.' Easter is, in a sense, the starting point of our Christian responsibilities. Living the Easter mystery means becoming a joyful Easter people. We must, therefore, be open to action and change. We cannot become stuck in our ways, crippled by doubt, despair or habit. As Pope Francis says, Easter shows us that 'it is always possible to begin anew, because there is always a new life that God can awaken in us in spite of all our failures.' The annual celebration of Easter reminds us that what we celebrate is present here and now. Ours is a living faith. As the Pope adds, 'faith is not an album of past memories; Jesus is not outdated. He is alive here and now.' Easter is a celebration of the mystery that Jesus is present. He is here, in both the need of the world and through the actions of His followers. So, having celebrated the mystery, we are sent forth to live it. 'Having made himself present in the heart of our world,' the Pope points out, Jesus 'invites us to overcome barriers, banish prejudices and draw near to those around us every day in order to rediscover the grace of everyday life.'

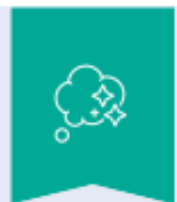

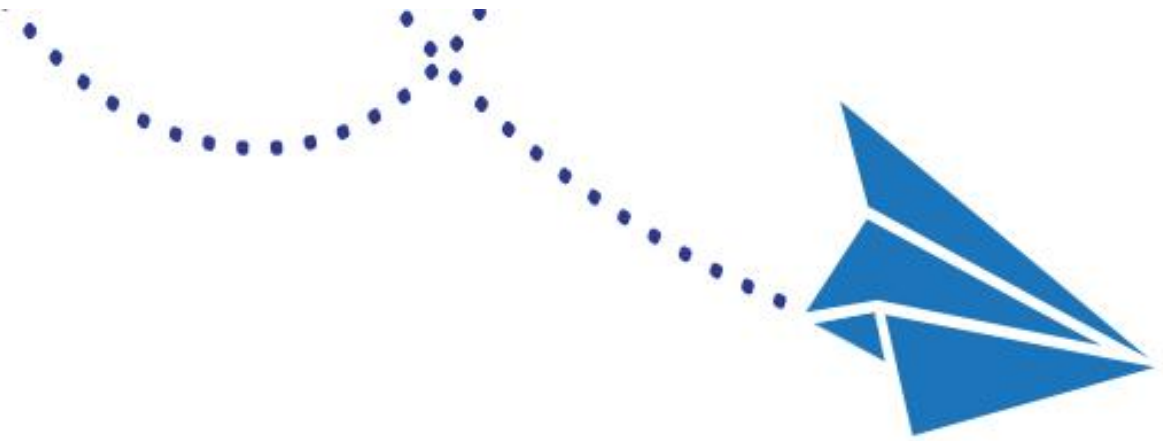

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### WHAT TO BRING

- ▶ **Wide-brimmed hat** – School hats are usually best. When the UV is 3 or above, children will be required to wear a hat. Sunscreen is provided and routinely applied as per our Sun Protection Policy. If your child is sensitive to standard broad-spectrum 30+ sunscreen, please provide appropriate sunscreen clearly labelled with your child's name.
- ▶ **Morning tea and lunch** – OOSH staff are not able to heat or cook food. Please ensure anything sent can be eaten straight from their lunch box. Our service is a nut-free zone. Breakfast and afternoon tea are provided.
- ▶ **Enclosed shoes** must be worn, such as joggers or sneakers.
- ▶ **Refillable water bottle.**
- ▶ **Spare set of clothes** in case of an accident or excessive mess.
- ▶ **Jumper or jacket**

### BOOKING CHECKLIST

No booking is accepted until all the following items have been completed and you have received emailed confirmation from your service's Nominated Supervisor:

- Complete our booking request through the Xplor Home app
- Confirm your enrolment details are up to date through Xplor (if you are not yet enrolled with St Nicholas OOSH, you will be sent a link)
- Any outstanding fees have been paid

### CHILD CARE SUBSIDY (CCS)

Did you know you are entitled to a discount of up to 90% off your fees through the Australian Government's Child Care Subsidy?

To ensure you receive your entitled subsidy, remember to confirm your CCS enrolment via the **Centrelink website** or app.

### CANCELLATIONS AND ABSENCE

To change your booking, simply reach out to the St Nicholas OOSH service you requested a booking for. Please note, our cancellation policy requires notice of five (5) business days for cancellation of Vacation Care bookings. If you cancel within 5 business days of your booking, you will be charged the full rate.

If your child is sick or otherwise unable to attend for one of your bookings, please let us know with as much notice as possible by phoning or texting the service's mobile number. Please note, you will still be liable for any fees incurred on this day. If children are unwell, please refrain from bringing them to care.

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Risk assessments are completed for all excursions and are available onsite for viewing. An OOSH staff member can provide a copy of any risk assessments to parents/ caregivers upon request.

*Please note, the suggested outcome may not meet the pedagogical intent of the planned experience. This is a broad suggestion, but should not be held as the only possibility. The choice of an outcome relates directly to the learning and benefits we anticipate children will gain from the experience, however should you wish to alter this outcome due to your own curriculum understanding, we welcome this.*
