2026 Class Preparation

On the morning of <u>Thursday 11 December</u>, we will spend time in our 2026 classes (and classrooms) with our 2026 teachers for our 'step up' morning 9:15-11 am. If your child is in YEAR 3 – 2026, their step-up day will be on WEDNESDAY 10 December, so that the children can meet Miss Meave Lawson, one half of the Year 3 group.

If you are leaving Rosary Park and your child/children will not be returning to school in 2026, <u>please</u> ensure that you have notified us as we have families looking for enrolments for next year and we're in the process of concluding our class lists for 2026.

If you are just moving to a new house or changing your workplace, please ensure that you provide up-to-date contact details before the start of the school year.

<u>Kindergarten 2026 Orientation</u>

We will be soon concluding our formal Kindergarten 2026 orientation sessions. These were held over 3 sessions and gave parents and children the opportunity to visit in both large and small groups, becoming more familiar and comfortable with their new school setting. I thank Kylie Lunn and Ellen Rae (Kindergarten 2025 / 2026 teachers) for the enormous amount of work they put into these sessions. Any feedback on these sessions is always appreciated.

Swimming Carnival

Our carnival will be held on <u>Friday 28 November</u> at Singleton Pool. As this event is for Representation for Primary students in 2026, our Kinder or Year 6 children will not attend the carnival. Instead, they will remain at school.

Supervision of Students Before 8:30am

We have recently noticed an increasing number of students arriving and waiting on school grounds near the office before 8:30am, which is before the commencement of school supervision and school operations. This rule has not changed in over a year.

To ensure the safety and wellbeing of all students, we ask that children are not dropped off before 8:30am, as staff supervision does not begin until this time. Students who arrive early are unsupervised, which presents a potential safety risk.

Families who require care before 8:30am are encouraged to access St Nicholas OOSH Branxton, located on site here at Rosary Park. For details, please contact oosh-branxton@stnicholasmn.org.au.

We appreciate your support in helping us maintain a safe environment for all our students. Please contact the school directly if you have any questions or require further information.

Advanced Notice

In 2026, our year 5 students will attend Great Aussie Bush Camp 15-17 June in 2026 (approx. cost \$450/child) whilst our year 6 students will have their excursion to Canberra on 19 – 21 August 2025 (approx. cost \$500/child). As these excursions are a significant financial commitment for families (not covered by our resource fee), I am giving you advanced notice so that you are able to budget for them.

School fee information for 2026 will be sent out once received by the Catholic Schools Office. Our school resource fee is \$610.

Semester 2 Student Reports

Our semester 2 reports will be published for all children in week 9 of this term. You will be notified via a compass notification when they are available.

Year 6 parents need to be aware their access to these reports will be cut off from the last day of school this year as the children are removed from our school system. We suggest you download and save or print off your child's reports before the end of the year.

End of Year Teacher Gifts

At this time of year, some families want to give staff members an end of year Christmas gift. Whilst this is appreciated, it is not necessary. Our greatest gift is seeing your children enjoy learning and reaching their full potential.

The Catholic Schools Office has a detailed Gifts and Benefits Policy that requires substantial gifts to be declared and, sometimes, returned.

Under this policy, it is not appropriate for parents to take up collections of money from families to present one gift to their class teacher or another staff member.

If you choose to give a gift to a staff member, this is your personal choice. Please consider a card with a special message inside instead.

The Children and Young Person's (Care and Protection) Act 1998

Parents/Carers need to be aware that as teachers in the state of NSW we are required by law to report certain information to the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ). Reports to the Child Protection Helpline (Ph. 132 111, 24 hrs/7 days) must be made where we have reasonable grounds to suspect that a child or young person is at risk of significant harm and our concerns are current. Risk of significant harm may occur from a single act or omission or to a series of acts or omissions.
