#### **Advanced Notice**

#### **End of Year Awards**

Reminder that the end of year awards will be held at school on **Friday 12<sup>th</sup> December at 9:45am**. There will also be a section of seating assigned for Yr5 parents of children who prepared and delivered speeches for 2026 leadership roles. <u>Please note that parents will NOT be informed if their child was successful in obtaining a leadership role prior to the ceremony.</u>

All 2026 student team school leaders, as well as sports leaders will be announced as a part of this end of school year liturgy and awards ceremony.

#### End of Year PB4L Reward – Water Play Day

On Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> December we will celebrate our year of Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) rewards with Water Play Day. There will be a timetable giving each grade time to participate in water fun games outside for a period of the day. Our Year 6 PB4L team and teachers will help to run the games for the children.

Details for children -

- Come to school in old clothes or swimmers with board shorts, a t-shirt AND a hat. (Shoulders
  must be covered and children <u>MUST</u> have a hat and closed in shoes to participate.)
- Children bring their sports uniform AND shoes to get changed into after the water activities.
- Shoes will get wet, so a spare pair and socks is recommended.
- Please bring a towel to dry off and a plastic bag to put wet things in.
- Clothes will get wet and may get dirty old clothes please.

PLEASE ENSURE ALL ITEMS ARE CLEARLY LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.

Each class will be allocated 30 minutes throughout the day to participate in the water activities.

#### **Social Media Account Age Restrictions**

As you would be aware, from 10 December 2025, Australia will introduce laws that prevent anyone under the age of 16 from creating or maintaining accounts on major social media platforms. The legislation, or social media delay, is designed to protect the mental health and wellbeing of young people.

The responsibility for enforcing these restrictions lies with the social media companies, not with students, parents or schools.

#### **Holiday Learning**

Don't forget to keep learning during the holiday break. There are many simple ways to continue the learning for your child/children during the holidays. Never underestimate the impact of participating in simple learning games and activities with your child/children. One of the most valuable things you can do with your child/children is to read with them. Not only does this build their vocabulary, but also their oral language and comprehension.

#### For younger children

- Identify numbers and letters/words in the environment when driving in the car, walking around town or at the shops
- Play karaoke let children read the words and sing, this builds graphological or picture (what a word looks like) knowledge to assist reading and spelling
- Build multiplication knowledge identify grids or arrays in the environment how many rows and how many columns
- Cook together talk about mass the meaning of kg, g, I, ml etc
- Use adjectives (describing words) to describe some objects in nature who can think of the most describing words
- If you must watch something on a screen, turn on subtitles for more exposure to print
- Count down the days of the holidays on a calendar
- Use an analogue clock to identify bedtime, bath time etc Where is the big hand? What does it mean when the big hand is on 6? etc
- Categorise objects using various criteria eg. Size, shape, colour, manmade/natural
- Use items in the environment to create an artwork

#### For older children

- Estimate the total of a group of objects in the trolley
- Calculate the cost of a day out movie tickets plus the cost of lunch for the whole family etc

- Cook together double or halve the ingredients in a recipe to allow for more/less people
- Read the instructions to a new game
- Read a book with your child you read left hand pages and they read the right ask
  questions about the text and different words to build comprehension and vocabulary
  knowledge.
- Design an outdoor obstacle course and time how long it takes to complete the activities can you get faster over the holidays?
- Use a calendar
- Tell the time on an analogue clock

As we come to the end of the year, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for entrusting Rosary Park with the education of your children. I feel blessed to have the opportunity to work with so many wonderful families and children every day.

To those leaving our community, I wish you every happiness for the future, may you always remember the lessons and values you've been taught at Rosary Park, and for those returning next year, I look forward to working with you again in 2026.

I wish you all a safe, happy and holy Christmas time. I hope you have the chance to spend some quality time with your family and friends.

## First Nations Game: Birray

**Description:** This is a game where a chaser (birray) attempts to tag (touch) other players.

Players: 4 - 8 (recommended for younger children)

Playing area: A space big enough to run around without any obstacles

#### Game play and basic rules:

- Players spread out around the playing area.
- Shutting their eyes (or blindfolded) the player who takes the part of the birray (march-fly) runs about trying to catch (touch) another player in the group.
- As soon as the player is successful, he or she makes an unpleasant noise (imitating the insect's buzz) near the ear of the player caught and also give him or her a 'pretend' pinch (indicative of the sting). The player caught (touched) becomes the new birray and the game continues.


#### Play suggestions:
